

FORMER BOARD PRESIDENT



MEET CIRCULAR INDIANA

WE'VE CHANGED. FOR GOOD.

On America Recycles Day (November 15) 2021, the Indiana Recycling Coalition became CIRCULAR INDIANA. The change represents a major step in our evolution to go beyond recycling and fully embrace the circular economy in our mission. We're investing in proactive advocacy, strengthening our partnerships, broadening our engagement, serving more diverse communities, and leading the effort to inspire action for a more circular economy in Indiana. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

FEDERAL POLICY

The <u>Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act</u>, signed into law in November of 2021, includes support for recycling. The bill includes the formerly stand-alone RECYCLE Act, which aims to improve residential recycling by authorizing up to \$15 million per year in recycling education grants over the next five years.

Two components of the stalled federal legislation, the Break Free from Plastic Pollution Act, <u>could be made into stand-alone bills in 2022</u>. Legislators are considering introducing bills that create a national bottle deposit and set federal guidelines around recycling labeling.



STATE POLICY

The Indiana legislative session kicked off Tuesday, January 4, 2022. This is a non-budget year; and therefore, a short session. Circular Indiana, in collaboration with its manufacturing partners and IDEM, helped author the Central Indiana Waste Diversion Pilot Project component of HB1226. The pilot project assigns a percentage of the Recycling Market Development Fund allocated each year to fund one or more pilot projects focused on waste diversion in Central Indiana. The project also requires the board to prioritize funding applications that divert and productively reuse the greatest amount of waste to markets within Indiana. HB1226 was assigned to the House Environmental Affairs Committee and successfully passed out of committee on January 25 with unanimous, bi-partisan support. It recently passed out of the full House and now moves over to the Senate for continued consideration. Circular Indiana continues to work with IDEM and partners to advance it. Stay tuned for more updates in the coming weeks!

AROUND THE US

MARYLAND: Maryland becomes the most recent state to set policies focusing on <u>organics recycling strategies</u>. One policy requires large producers to seek alternative disposal methods for food waste such as anaerobic digestion or composting. A different policy focuses on strategies to make residential organics recycling easier, such as prohibiting homeowners associations from banning backyard composting or composting pick up services.

WASHINGTON: Enacted in mid-2021, the Washington law sets <u>minimum recycled content standards</u> for certain types of plastic packaging, such as food and beverage containers, plastic bags, household products, and more. The bill also bans certain types of expanded polystyrene plastics, more commonly known as styrofoam.

CALIFORNIA: California passed a number of bills in late 2021 intended to support the circular economy in the state. The most notable bill sets <u>new labeling standards for the use of the chasing arrows</u> or recycling symbol. There are currently no federal standards for when a product can be considered "recyclable," which leads to confusion among consumers about what can and cannot be put in their recycling bin. The California bill limits the use of the term "recyclable" to only the products which are commonly recyclable in a majority of communities within the state.

NEW JERSEY: New Jersey's <u>newest recycling bill</u>, which sets new standards for minimum recycled content in certain types of packaging, was signed into law on January 18, 2022. The bill requires minimum percentages of postconsumer recycled material (PCR) in plastic, glass, and paper packaging manufactured or sold in New Jersey. The minimum required amounts vary by material and are set to increase over time.



END OF YEAR FUNDRAISING

Our end of year fundraising campaign results are in—we exceeded our goal with a final total of \$15,700! This more than tripled the match from our incredible Board of Directors, who contributed almost \$4,500 towards our match. Thanks to all of our supporters for playing a role in strengthening the circular economy in Indiana—love really does make the world go circular! What a great way for us to roll into the new year!

PROGRAMS UPDATES

LICENSE PLATES

We have a new name and a new look, and soon, a new license plate to match! The new license plate design will be available at the BMV starting on July 1, 2022. Here's a brief summary of what you need to know:

CURRENT LICENSE PLATE HOLDERS WITH A RENEWAL DATE BEFORE JULY 1:

Your plate will continue to have the old plate design at your time of renewal. After July 1, you can choose to update your plate to the new design OR you can keep your existing plate until the BMV sends you a replacement plate (done automatically 7 years after you purchased/replaced your current plate).

CURRENT LICENSE PLATE HOLDERS WITH A RENEWAL DATE AFTER JULY 1: at

the time of your renewal, you can choose to update your plate to the new design OR you can keep your existing plate until the BMV sends you a replacement plate, (done automatically 7 years after you purchased your current plate).

DON'T HAVE A LICENSE PLATE YET? For the coolest wheels in Indiana, choose the specialty plate option when renewing or purchasing a new license plate—

we are the "Recycling Coalition" option (often listed on the second page or back side of the BMV's specialty plate flier). If getting your plate after July 1, the design will change—more details to come!



INDIANAPOLIS CIRCULAR ECONOMY INITIATIVE

The City of Indianapolis recently completed its Solid Waste Minimization Plan and will be releasing the information to the public soon. The next ICEI meeting is scheduled for Thursday, February 10 at 10:30am via Zoom.

FULL CIRCLE EVENT

PARTNER UPDATES

U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY

On America Recycles Day, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) unveiled its National Recycling Strategy: Part One of a Series on Building a Circular Economy, which identifies actions to address challenges facing the U.S. municipal solid waste recycling system. The EPA is seeking partners to implement these actions to create a stronger, more resilient, and more cost-effective domestic recycling system. View the full Strategy on the EPA website.

National Recycling Coalition (NRC) President Bob Gedert recently shared his 2022 NRC President's Update with State Recycling Organizations so that we can pass it along to you. All Circular Indiana members receive a complimentary membership to the NRC.

INDIANA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGMENT

On December 10, 2021 <u>Governor Holcomb named a new Commissioner</u> for the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM), <u>Brian Rockensuess</u>, following the departure of Bruno Pigott from the role. Pigott stepped down in early December to become Deputy Assistant Administrator in the Office of Water for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

COMMITMENT TO ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE

Circular Indiana has been exploring our role - as individuals and as an organization - in the fight against systemic racism and for environmental justice for the past few years. In 2021, our Environmental Justice Task Force recommended including a deeper and broader review of our Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) policies and practices by an expert in the field. As part of our process to create a new Strategic Plan, we have hired Doneisha Posey to serve as our DEI consultant to help us weave DEI into the fabric of our organization and create a plan with actionable steps and accountability. Stay tuned—we look forward to sharing the new Strategic Plan later this year.

IDEM is now accepting nominations for the <u>2022 Governor's Awards for Environmental Excellence</u>. These awards recognize individuals and organizations which have implemented outstanding environmental strategies into their operations and decision-making processes. The selection process is highly competitive, and only one award per category will be presented during a ceremony in September annually. The public is invited to submit nominations and organizations may self-nominate. Nominations must be received by IDEM no later than **5:00 PM EST on Monday**, April **4, 2022**.

PRATT INDUSTRIES

In mid-December, Pratt Industries broke ground on a paper mill and box plant in Henderson, KY and <u>announced</u> it would invest an additional \$100 million in the facility, for a total investment of \$500 million.

In mid-January, Pratt Industries also announced it has acquired a 60,000 square foot warehouse in Whitestown, IN which is currently under renovation, to support the new Kentucky mill.


ROBERT CHRISTIAN
