INDIANA RECYCLING COALITION TO KICKOFF 30TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION AT 30TH ANNUAL CONFERENCE

INDIANAPOLIS – The Indiana Recycling Coalition (IRC) is celebrating its 30th year as an Indiana nonprofit organization by kicking off a year-long celebration campaign at its 2019 Annual Conference and Trade Show, June 10-12 at the Indianapolis Marriott East Hotel & Conference Center.

The campaign aims to celebrate the past, present, and future of the organization by recognizing key leaders, sharing member's stories of impact, and raising funds to fuel its mission of working together to strengthen the circular economy in Indiana. Over the year-long celebration (June 2019-June 2020), the IRC will identify and recognize 30 Recycling Rockstars; individuals who have made a significant impact on the organization, its mission, and sustainable materials management in the state of Indiana. The IRC will be profiling these individuals on their website and social media using the hashtag #IRCturns30. The IRC also aims to raise \$30,000 prior to the culmination of the campaign, which will conclude with a Celebration Event in June 2020.

The celebration campaign will launch at the 2019 IRC Annual Conference and Trade Show, which is the organization's 30th consecutive event. Conference attendees will learn about the latest developments and innovations in the waste reduction, reuse, recycling, and composting industries over the course of 3 days via informative panel sessions, speakers, and exhibitor displays. Waste & sustainability professionals from all backgrounds, including state & local governments, manufacturers and service providers, education institutions, and nonprofits will form new connections through the Conference's multiple networking opportunities. This year's conference features Keynote Luncheon speaker Dr. Kenneth Miller, PhD, whose talk is titled "Beyond Recycling: The Case for Embracing the Circular Economy in Indiana." IDEM Commissioner Bruno Pigott will be providing opening remarks.

As Greg Spratt, President of IRC's Board of Directors, notes, "The Indiana Recycling Coalition has evolved significantly over the past 30 years and has become one of the largest and most stable state recycling organizations in the county. We are blessed to have a legacy of dedicated leadership and strong partnerships that have enabled the organization to achieve several policy advocacy victories, including establishing a state recycling goal and defeating a proposed dirty recycling materials processing facility in Indianapolis in 2016." IRC Executive Director Allyson Mitchell, the organization's third person to hold this role, states, "This is an exciting time to celebrate a milestone anniversary, especially given the recent dramatic shifts in the recycling industry. As we look to our future, we are focused on working with the City of Indianapolis to

remedy its decades-long recycling challenges, expand our education and advocacy impact, and help every Hoosier understand their role in Indiana's circular economy."
