


FILMING at the IRC Office

Aaron Friedrich is a Principal Consultant with ERM, a consulting firm that creates innovative solutions to sustainability challenges. Aaron has a passion for leading a paradigm shift that makes waste reduction and reuse/recycling a standard in our everyday lives—not just as something that people feel obligated or compelled to do. To him, the board is composed of a dynamic group of individuals representing a broad range of sectors, companies, and organizations and integrates aspects of the circular economy at these different levels. The knowledge sharing among board members is one of things Aaron has enjoyed most about being a part of



the IRC team, and it empowers him to spread this education beyond the board to make an even bigger impact throughout Indiana.



Ron Lehan works for Pratt Industries, a producer of 100% recycled containerboard and a long-time sponsor of the IRC. As a board member, he recognizes that the IRC's greatest impact is our commitment to reduce waste and strengthen the circular economy in Indiana. Ron's involvement has led him to personally adopt new waste habits, like considering how to reduce waste or reuse items before disposal. In the future, he would like to see the IRC reach lawmakers to draft legislation which encourages better recycling policies and processes statewide.

Ken Miller has decades of experience in the plastics and chemical industry and is a leading voice in the movement for a more circular Indiana. Ken envisions an Indiana that leads in the circular economy, rather than lags behind, and believes that the IRC has two major impacts. First, the IRC's network provides the forum to have significant conversations on the importance of recycling and the circular economy. Second, the IRC's presence is a driving force in improving curbside recycling in Indianapolis. To Ken, the future of the IRC is in advancing the circular economy through education, policy, public/private partnerships, and holding the public, businesses, and government to a higher level of responsibility.
